







Regional Inception Workshop on

National Plan of Action for Small Scale Fisheries (NPOA-SSF)

20 - 22 November 2025 Lotus Tower, Colombo, Sri Lanka





Introduction

The Bay of Bengal Programme Inter-Governmental Organisation (BOBP-IGO), a regional fisheries body established in 2003, supports its member countries (Bangladesh, India, Maldives, and Sri Lanka) in enhancing livelihoods and quality of life for small-scale fisherfolk in the Bay of Bengal region. As part of its implementation of the Bay of Bengal Large Marine Ecosystem (BOBLME) project, the BOBP-IGO organized a High-Level Meeting in the Maldives on 20 February 2025 to provide policy guidance on mainstreaming the Ecosystem Approach to Fisheries (EAF) in small-scale fisheries (SSF) in the region. The meeting highlighted the need for better characterization of small-scale fisheries in BOBP-IGO member countries and recognized small-scale fisheries as vital for coastal livelihoods, food security, and sustainable development. Key messages included the importance of NPOA-SSFs, ecosystem health, climate adaptation, and capacity management. Countries requested BOBP-IGO's support to stakeholders that take part in the small-scale fisheries subsector regarding community-based capacity building, improved market access, piloting ecosystem-based projects, and technical support. These recommendations were endorsed by the XIII Governing Council, which mandated BOBP-IGO to lead regional capacity development and support NPOA-SSF formulation. To facilitate the preparation of NPOA-SSF, the FAO has developed a set of tools that outline the key stages and steps in the NPOA-SSF process and clarifies the foundational principles that should guide its development and implementation in line with the SSF Guidelines.

A Regional Capacity Development Workshop was organised during 17–19 September 2025 in Chennai, India, to build capacity on the NPOA-SSF development process. This training workshop brought together proposed core team members of the SSF national task forces (NTFs) that will be established for the NPOA-SSF process in Bangladesh, India, Maldives, and Sri Lanka, including small-scale fisheries actors, government officials, researchers, and CSOs/NGOs. During the workshop, each participating country drafted preliminary national roadmaps and made formal commitments to establish the full NTFs and initiate their NPOA-SSF development processes. Building on members' action, the Colombo workshop will mark the official launch of the NTFs, provide additional capacity building for members, and enable countries to complete initiation-stage activities as outlined in FAO's NPOA-SSF framework.

In addition, the Sri Lankan government is organizing a special event called "Aqua Planet" from 21st to 23 November in Colombo at the same venue – Lotus Tower. This event aims to create awareness about the World Fisheries Day and its importance and highlight Sri Lanka's Fisheries sector, seafood industry and sustainable practices. The event will be inaugurated on 21st November in the morning by the Hon. Prime Minister of Sri Lanka.

Hence, a special session on NPOA-SSF will be included in the inauguration programme agenda on the morning of 21st November. This high-level session will mark *World Fisheries Day 2025* and celebrate the contributions of small-scale fishers to livelihoods, food security, and sustainable development in the Bay of Bengal region.



Specific Objectives

The workshop will:

- Officially launch National Task Forces (NTFs) for the four countries and provide additional capacity building for the NTF members.
- Advance initiation-stage activities: SSF profile validation, stakeholder mapping and consultation planning, national platform and NPOA-SSF development planning.
- 3. Celebrate World Fisheries Day on 21st November
- 4. Refine national roadmaps and detail NPOA-SSF development plans.
- 5. Consolidate a regional roadmap under BOBP-IGO.
- 6. Agree on immediate next steps, risks, and support needs.

Participants

- National Task Force (NTF) members from Bangladesh, India, Maldives, Sri Lanka consisting of Government officials (nominated by the fisheries ministry and department of fisheries), SSF organizations, academia/research and NGOs.
- Representatives from BOBP-IGO, FAO, ICSF, RAG and other relevant experts.

Expected Outputs

By the end of the workshop:

- NTFs officially launched with confirmed membership, roles, Terms of Reference (ToRs) and operating modalities.
- Capacity building of NTFs will have been completed.
- Initiation-stage-related outputs as below will be in an advanced stage:
 - o SSF profiles refined and validated for the four countries, including national policy and legal diagnostic reviews and the Illuminating Hidden Harvests (IHH) methodology, characterization and infographics
 - Refined stakeholder maps for each country, with strategies for inclusive consultation.
 - Updated problem/rationale statements articulating why each country needs an NPOA-SSF.
 - o Refined national roadmaps including a detailed NPOA-SSF development plan.
 - Agreement on national platform and national communication/coordination mechanisms for NTF operations.
- A consolidated regional roadmap supporting national processes under BOBP-IGO.

Logistic Arrangements

BOBP-IGO, in partnership with Ministry of Fisheries, Aquatic and Ocean Resources, Government of Sri Lanka, will coordinate all local arrangements, including venue management, travel and accommodation logistics, vendor contracting, outreach activities and technical support to the countries for NPOA-SSF related deliverables.

FAO will provide technical guidance, nominate experts and support the development of communication materials.

The workshop will be conducted in English.
